THEME: Fueling the Innovation Economy for Impact: Role of Government, Private Sector & Capital

Sankalp Forum's focus over the years has been its work with Impact Investors and Social Businesses. During the Global Sankalp Summit 2014, we unveiled our 5-year plan to focus on inclusive development by identifying Corporates as the third pillar in furthering the enterprise-based development approach. Since the last Summit, through various discussions, inputs from our partners and collaborators, we have been looking at countries and societies that have found a way to be more inclusive as they have evolved. We sought characteristics that were culturally and contextually neutral and would be relevant and adoptable by the rest of the world. Our analysis clearly indicates that inclusive societies have been able to leverage innovation in disrupting and breaking age-old hierarchies and dogmas. It is equally evident that Governments have played a fairly strong role during transition period in bringing about changes *en masse* and in several cases, have also been the harbinger of Innovations.

Innovation inspires disruption in the natural evolution and hence is a critical component in making the world more equitable. We have witnessed how internet and mobile telephony have converted the world into a global village in a very short time, integrating us across race, regions and gender, and flattening pyramids worldwide even beyond their country of origin. Having acknowledged the power of innovations in making countries and societies inclusive, we would like to explore the interplay of innovation with Capital, Social Business and Corporates in defining the future for a more inclusive world. We would collectively ponder over who will finance the ecosystem around Innovation and discuss what could truly inspire scaling up of Innovation.

Equally critical and probably controversial has been the role of Government as an actor in building inclusive societies and as a crucial change agent. The Government is credited for inspiring and launching Innovations such as the internet and even funding initial seeds of venture capital, as also inspiring movements like Green Revolution and White Revolution. At the same time, the world over it is often accused of being the biggest bottleneck in furthering inclusive agenda by discouraging Innovators and emerging entrepreneurship with bureaucratic thinking. What is clear to us is that while the Government may evoke massively positive and negative sentiments, its gigantic presence, ability to mobilize resources to influence the inclusive agenda and its core responsibility towards build a more inclusive society cannot be discounted or overlooked?

We look forward in engaging with the Government at the Global Sankalp Summit 2015 to discuss its role vis-a-vis that of Corporates and Small Businesses as partners through Public Private Partnerships, as financiers of business and innovation and as a policy driver to promote inclusion.

Innovation as a trigger for Inclusion, Government as an actor in mainstreaming equitable development, and their interplay with Social Business, Capital and Corporates would be the core focus of the Global Sankalp Summit 2015.
